GOALS OF THE ET PROGRAM

- Expand the program
- Hire diverse instructors
- Articulate with the high schools
- Articulate with the 4-year universities
- Develop new environmental projects and programs
- Become a valuable environmental resource for our bioregion

EXPANDING THE ET PROGRAM

- Goal: Expand the ET program
- Method: Divide the ET program into 3 emphasis
 - »Environmental Management
 - »Occupational Health and Safety
 - »Environmental Science
- Status: Program in front of dean for review and comment

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT EMPHASIS

- Environmental management is the current emphasis of the program
- No new courses necessary to create this emphasis

PROPOSING A NEW OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY EMPHASIS

- Occupational Safety (2 new courses)
- Industrial Hygiene (3 new courses)
- Toxicology (1 course, existing)
- Intro. to ET (1 course, existing)

PROPOSING A NEW ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE EMPHASIS

- A multi–disciplinary emphasis
 - » Environmental Technology
 - » Environmental Chemistry
 - » Environmental Biology
- Students can enter the emphasis from the above three existing programs
- The dean of Chemistry and Biology has rejected the idea
- Will propose again with a full compliment of chemistry and biology instructors

PROPOSING A NEW COOPERATIVE WORK EXPERIENCE (INTERNSHIP) COURSE

- A mandatory 2 to 4 credit course
- For all emphases

PROPOSING TO CUT THE 4-UNIT SAFETY & EMERG. RESPONSE (40-HOUR/HAZWOPER) COURSE INTO A 2-UNIT COURSE

- The 4–unit course will remain
- New 2-unit course will serve the following populations
 - »High school girls—at—risk
 - »Current employees who need training
 - Prospective employees that need the training to work in the field
- Will seek U.S. EPA certification for the course

NEW 40-HOUR COURSE AT SWEETWATER HIGH SCHOOL

- New 40-hour course for girls at risk
- Invited back a second time
- Propose to make course a college course

NEW COURSES BEING EXPLORED

- Pollution Prevention
- Solid waste management
- NOTE: Articulation agreements with 4-year universities have to be renegotiated after new courses introduced
- What topics should be taught in the future?

HIRING DIVERSE INSTRUCTORS

- New Chicana Toxicologist on staff
- Discussing working with a Chicano emergency response specialist

ARTICULATING WITH HIGH SCHOOLS

- Performed outreach to graduating seniors with SWC counselors last spring
 was able to attract 1 student
- Formulating a 2 + 2
 program for first and second semester seniors
 - »will need support from high school teachers, counselors, and administrators
 - » success partially depends on articulation with 4-year universities
 - Will need transportation to SWC

ARTICULATING WITH UNIVERSITIES

- Articulated with CSU
 Bakersfield for a BA degree
 in Environmental Resource
 Management on the
 Internet
- Articulating with United States International University for a BA in Environmental Studies
 - » Program coordinator approved articulation
 - »Articulation officer has to approve articulation

TRYING TO ARTICULATE WITH UNIVERSITIES IN MEXICO

- Proposing to work with 2– and 4–year colleges in Northern Baja Mexico
- Need to articulate the ET program with UCSD and San Diego State University. The program needs YOUR support on this!

DEVELOP NEW ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS

- Obtained second Regional Environmental Business Resource and Assistance Center (REBRAC) grant with Cuyamaca & Palomar Colleges
 - SWC lawyer changed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Cuyamaca
 - Some changes based on my concerns
 - Some changes were her legal changes
 - REBRAC Director, Michael Hall, may balk at the changes and refuse to approve the MoU. I may
